GAHS Gets a New Look



Ruth Byrne Award Winner is October's Speaker

We're in for a real treat at our upcoming October 28th meeting, at which we are welcoming **David Chang** as our guest speaker.

David was awarded the 2013 Ruth Byrne Historic Preservation Award, and is owner of Chang Investments, Inc. A leading Glendale businessman, David is dedicated to the preservation and restoration of Glendale's historic resources, including the Coury Building (1940), the Gillett Building (1909) and the Humphrey and Davidson Building (1895).

With a vision for these buildings, David invested his money into a

beautiful restoration and adaptive reuse of the Coury Building, and opened it as Zang's Asian Bistro. Next, he carefully restored Glendale's oldest commercial building, using the wood in the flooring to decorate the interior and saving, cleaning and repairing its tin ceiling. It opened as Zing's restaurant. David kept the exterior of the Gillett Building as

it was, and changed nothing in its second level office space. With energy and vision, David is now restoring the store adjacent to the Humphrey and Davidson Building, soon to open as the Star Venue Theater for live performances. David's downtown transformation expresses his dedication to preserving its historic character.

Historic District Signs

Glendale has ten historic districts on the National Register of Historic Places. The first six have historic district street signs, funded by the city, but there was no funding available for the other four.

The Glendale Arizona Historical Society applied for and received grants for historic district street signs from the Glendale Civic Pride Ambassadors for Thunderbird Estates/McDonald Addition, Sands Estates, Glendale Gardens and Sages Acres. The City of Glendale's sign shop installed all the signs.

The partnership of the Glendale Arizona Historical Society, the Civic Pride Ambassadors and the City of Glendale has resulted in beautiful historic district street signs, which allow residents and visitors to identify and enjoy Glendale's history at a glance.



What's in a Report Card

Eighty-one years ago in 1932, Glendale Public Schools issued a report card to a 9 year old young man in the 4th grade, which meant he could be promoted to the 5th grade. This report card not only graded the student's scholarship - his writing, English, spelling, arithmetic, geography and U.S. History, but it also graded his obedience, behavior, dependability, courtesy, cleanliness, care of property, health and hygiene, and work habits. This boy was excellent in all areas except work habits. The card also had a Physical Record section to record the student's weight and vision: 10-10 normal, 8-10 somewhat defective, and 6-10 or lower to be tested by an optometrist. Following is an unusual inclusion on the report card called "Rules of the Health Game."

- ✓ **A tub bath more than once a week.**
- ✓ **Brush the teeth in the morning and night.**
- ✓ **Long hours of sleep with windows open.**
- ✓ **Drink all the milk possible, but no tea or coffee.**
- ✓ **Eat vegetables and fruit every day.**
- ✓ **Drink a glass of water before breakfast and three or more times during the day.**
- ✓ **Lots of sunshine and play.**
- ✓ **A bowel movement every day.**
- ✓ **Take three or four deep breaths, completely filling the lungs, on your way to and from school.**
- ✓ **Wash hands before meals.**
- ✓ **No candy or sweets between meals.**

This particular report card was for Harold Smith, son of Dr. and Mrs. Harold W. Smith. Smith was Superintendent of Glendale Schools from 1925 to 1964. Isn't it amazing what's in a report card?
